#### All ISO Management Standards require a Policy commitment to comply to:

- Applicable Statutory and regulatory requirements
- Compliance Obligations
- Legal and Other requirements

#### **What are Compliance Obligations**

"legal requirements and other requirements that an organization has to comply with, and other requirements that an organization has to or chooses to comply with"

(ISO 14001:2015)

Supports decision making and priority setting




A good Register provides a source of information that can be shared across the business

Secondary Legislation	Regulations and Orders	<ul> <li>Producer Responsibility Obligations (Packaging Waste) Regulations 2007</li> <li>Producer Responsibility Obligations (Packaging Waste) (Amendment) Regulations 2023</li> </ul>
Compacts and Treaties	Collective agreements between National States	<ul> <li>Basel – Transboundary Waste</li> <li>Stockholm Convention – Persistent Organic Pollutants</li> </ul>
Regulatory Obligations	Obligations arising from a Regulator	Guidance for Pollution Prevention – GPP Approved Code of Practice – L8 Legionella

Supply Chain Requirements	Sector based requirements	Safety Systems in Procurement – SSIP Achilles Joint Supply Chain Accreditation Register (JOSCAR)
Standards	Requirements for doing business	ISO Standards IEC Standards Product Standards PAS Standards



## Information within a Compliance Register

Scope and Purpose

This Register covers the Environmental Legislation that affects the operations at Head Office

Compliance Obligation	Responsibility	Applicability	Description of Applicability	Controls
List of Obligations	Who is responsible?	<ul><li> Direct</li><li> Indirect</li><li> Information Only</li></ul>	Why is this applicable to your business	What controls do you have in place?
The Clean Air Act 1990	Fleet Manager	Direct	We operate a fleet of vehicles that work in Central London so need to manage emissions	Fleet Management Process Vehicle Servicing
CDM Regulations 2015	Facilities Manager	Indirect	Potential requirement if we go ahead with an extension to our Building	Supplier Management and Selection Risk Assessment Procedure
PPN 06/21 Carbon Reporting	Compliance Manager	Information Only	This is information as it is a potential item we could use to report our carbon emissions for tenders	Carbon reporting



#### What do Auditors want to see?



#### Want top marks? Ensure you have the following:

- An Up-to-Date Register
- A process for identifying and assessing Compliance Obligations
- An audit plan that covers Compliance Obligations (by competent Auditors)
- Evidence that updates come from a reliable source
- Evidence that the Compliance Obligations have been reviewed
- Evidence that you are adding new / amended Compliance Obligations to your system and processes
- Auditors will take assurance if a wide range of people can explain legal requirements (e.g. Waste, that the Compliance Manager and also the person overseeing waste collections can talk about WTN).
